ELIGIBLE BREEDS

Open to all dogs at least 12 months of age that are individually registered with the AKC, recorded in the FSS program, dogs with PAL numbers or any other dog, including mixed breeds, enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program. Females in season may not enter.

Refund Policy

- Refunds will be given for dogs withdrawn before closing. If closing occurs because of entry limits a refund will be given only if another entry is received to fill the vacancy.
- Full Refunds will be given for female dogs in season or any dogs who do not pass inspection.
- Refunds will equal the entry fee minus any transaction fees from Square

Entering the Event

We will be holding four (4) AKC FastCAT events.

- Two (2) Saturday
- Two (2) Sunday

To keep the number of participants (and their dogs) to a manageable level, we will be running the two events concurrently each day split into AM and PM groups

- Your dog can enter one run per event (maximum 2 per day). These runs can be done either in the morning (AM) or the afternoon (PM).
- Therefore, you can have one or two runs on Saturday (AM or PM) and one or two runs on Sunday (AM or PM)

When you enter you will have the following options:

A dog CANNOT be entered to run in both the AM and PM sessions.

Entries are limited to 60 runs in each of the two AM and PM runs for a total of 120 runs during each AM and PM time period

Only online entries will be accepted. No day of entries will be accepted.

- Entries close three days before the event, **WEDNESDAY April 29th 6 PM** or when entry limits are reached.
- **AFTER ENTRIES CLOSE** you will receive a confirmation email with a list of dogs entered with their run-numbers, AKC Number and other entry information.
- Corrections must be emailed to the event secretary by Thursday May 1..
- All dogs running in their selected time group must be inspected during the time period specified in the Premium. If dogs are not present during the specified inspection period, they will be considered absent and will not be run.

Any entry forms that are not completed correctly will be rejected and any fees collected will be refunded.

Event Specifics

- The field is fully fenced, and the entry gate is kept closed when dogs are running.
- We do not fence the course except in the catch area.
- Having fencing on the exhibitor side reduces the ability to watch the dogs enjoy their event.
- If your dog does not have a reliable recall or is afraid of other people trying to retrieve them or has never been to a practice or previous FastCAT then you might want to consider not entering the event.

Refunds

- Refunds will be made for cancellations made before entries close.
- Refunds will also be given for female dogs in season dogs that fail inspection during the event.

NOTES FOR FIRST TIME COURSERS AND HANDLERS

SLIP LEADS—There is a type of collar for coursing called a slip lead, which is worn only to control the dog prior to release. The collar drops away as the dog is released to chase the lure and they run without anything around their necks that could be dangerous. Use of a slip lead is recommended but not required. What is important is that, for the safety of your dog, there are no objects on the dog that can be caught by the string or lure.

INSPECTION—Dogs will be inspected by a designated Inspection Committee consisting of at least two persons who are members of the Field Committee and who shall inspect each entered dog for lameness, fitness to compete and female estrus (in season). Inspection shall take place prior to any form of wrapping being applied to the dog. In the opinion of the Inspection Committee, any entry found to be lame, unfit to compete or in season shall not be allowed to enter and the applicable entry fees shall be refunded. Dogs must be inspected before each event to assess whether an injury occurred since the last inspection.

WARM-UP, COOL-DOWN—It is highly recommended that all dogs running are walked out for about 10-15 minutes prior to and after their runs to get them warmed up and to cool them down. The warm up help reduce pulled muscles. The cool-down is very important to allow the dogs heart rate to slowly come to normal and because it helps prevent lactic acid build-up in the muscles that leads to soreness.

Plastic fencing will be used to define the end of the straight run.

Coming north on I-5

Take exit 195A/195B OR-569 Randy Pape/Beltline towards Eugene. Stay left and to continue on OR 569 Randy Pape/Beltline
In approximately 6.4 miles take exit 6 toward Eugene/Airport/Junction City. Stay in the left lane and turn left onto OR-99
In 0.5miles turn left on Clear Lake Road.
Continue on Clear Lake Road for 4.6miles
Turn left on Barker Road. In 0.3miles Barker Road will "T" at Shore Lane
Turn left on Shore Lane. Driveway will be immediately on your right

General

- All entries must be one year of age or older on the day of the test or trial.
- Dogs that have not arrived before the end of their Inspection Time as stated in the premium are considered absent. And will be scratched. Exceptions to this rule are up to the Trial Secretary .
- No refunds will be given for scratched dogs.
- Each entry will be examined and may be measured with a wicket at inspection. Inspection shall take place prior to any form of wrapping being applied to the dog. In the opinion of the inspection committee, any entry found to be lame, unfit to compete or a female in season shall not be allowed to enter and entry fees shall be refunded.
- Dogs must be inspected before each event.
- Entry fees shall be refunded for any entry that is withdrawn before entries close. Entries close April 30th or when limits are reached. No refund will be given for dogs withdrawn after the close of entry.
- Run order will be assigned at time of inspection.
- Dogs will be run by their run number with the following exceptions:
- Workers who are managing the event will be allowed to run their dogs at an appropriate time.
- Handlers with multiple dogs will have their dogs separated to allow them to walk their dogs out and retrieve the next dog
- If a dog is late for their run time, they will run at the end of the running order
- If dog needs to rerun this will happen at the discretion of the Paddock Master
- For safety reasons, it is preferred that dogs run "naked" without collars or harnesses. Dogs may wear any type of collar except choker collars, a collar with prongs or electronic training collar. Harnesses are allowed to get the dog to the line, but for safety please remove it before the dog runs. Muzzles are allowed. Please no metal collars or retractable leads.
- Electric continuous loop machines will be used. Lure will consist of white plastic bags
- The field committee reserves the right to alter the course plan as required by weather and/or field conditions on the day of the trial.
- The field committee reserves the right to bar known aggressive hounds from the event site.
- There will be a \$5 fine assessed for any loose hound not taking part in the course in progress, or for anybody caught not picking up after their dog or leaving garbage on the field.
- NO ONE will be allowed on the course without the express permission of the field chairman, except members of the field and event committee.
- Anybody exhibiting unsportsmanlike behavior will be excused from the field and may be subject to further disciplinary action.
- Control of dogs strictly enforced on leash at all times except when running.
- Clean up and carry out all trash.
- Please pick up all dog feces and remove with trash. DONOT put dog feces in portable toilets.

What is a FastCAT?

The FastCAT Test is a timed 100-yard dash for dogs. It is meant to be fun and healthy activity of interest to any dog owner. The following is a summary of how the event is structured.



How Does FastCAT Work?

- Dogs run one at a time
- In FastCAT, the dog chases a lure for 100 yards.
 - The dog's time to complete the 100-yard dash is recorded to the nearest 1/10 second is converted into MPHs
 - $MPH = 204.545 / (\text{dog's time in seconds})$
 - For example, dog's time 6.50sec. $MPH = 204.545 / 6.50 = 37.78\text{mph}$
- A handicap system is applied to a dog's MPH to determine the number of points earned. The handicap system is based on the height of the dog at its withers:
 - 18" or greater = handicap is 1.0
 - 12" up to less than 18" = handicap is 1.5
 - Below 12" = handicap is 2.0
- Points Earned:
 - The converted MPH is then multiplied by a potential handicap based on the dog's height to award points
 - Points = MPH multiplied by the dog's handicap.
- Titles
 - Beginner FastCAT (BCAT) = 150 points
 - Dock FastCAT (DCAT) = 500 points
 - FastCAT (FCAT) = 1,000 points
 - FastCAT # (FCAT#) = every additional 500 points
 - These suffix titles will appear on a dog's pedigree, with a higher-level title superseding a lower level title
 - Top 20 by Breed by Year:
 - The AKC Fast CAT website will feature the Top 20 Fastest Dogs by Breed by Year national standings. The standings will be updated as event results are processed
- Prior to running an inspection committee shall inspect each entry for lameness, fitness to compete and females in season. If necessary, the inspection committee is responsible for measuring dogs to determine their height at the withers.
- The Start:
 - Dogs may start at a maximum of 10 feet behind the starting line
 - The dog is timed from crossing the start line to the finish line
 - The owner/agent should release or have someone to release their dog
 - Prior to moving the lure to position it for the start, the lure operator shall announce "hold your dogs" to caution owners the lure will be moving
 - Time begins when the dog's nose crosses the start line
- The Finish:
 - The dog is timed from crossing the start line to the finish line
 - The owner/agent should have someone catch the dog at the finish line.
 - Time stops when the dog's nose crosses the finish line
- Lure Equipment:
 - Clubs may use either a drag or continuous loop system. If a continuous loop system is used the "return" string must be set outside of the running course. The lure operator and the lure equipment shall be safely positioned in a manner that does not interfere with the retrieval of the dog at the end of the course.
 - A white plastic bag and a squawker may be used for the lure.
- Course: The course must be essentially flat.
- The huntmaster has control of the course and oversees all dogs and handlers on the field. They shall:
 - ensure handlers understand safe release and retrieval procedures
 - ensure the lure is properly positioned
 - ensure the lure operator, timers and starting line signal person are ready
 - signal the lure operator to start the lure
 - give the verbal signal "tallyho" to release the dog.
