Entering FastCAT events

1. To keep the number of people on the grounds within limits we will be
 - Running both events each day concurrently.
 - When you register a dog for an event you will need to select the time session for running: AM (7am to 12pm) or PM (1pm to 6pm) and the number of runs you wish to enter each time period.
 - If you enter in the AM, your dog will run all runs in the AM. Likewise, if you register for the PM your dog will run all runs in the PM.
 - A dog CANNOT be entered to run in both the AM and PM sessions..
 - During each time period we will be running all the dogs entered in the first event. When finished we will start running all the dogs in the second event.
 - Entries for AM and PM will be limited to 60 per AM or PM time period.
2. Only online entries will be accepted. No day of entries will be accepted. This reduces the need to interact with the event secretary.
3. Entries close three days before the event, April 30th or when entry limits are filled before April 30th. We will email a list of dogs entered with their run-numbers, AKC Number and other entry information. Corrections must be emailed to the event secretary by Thursday May 1.
4. The field is fully fenced and the entry gate is kept closed when dogs are running. We do not fence the course except the catch area. Having fencing on the exhibitor side reduces the ability to watch the dogs enjoy their event. *If your dog does not have a reliable recall or is afraid of other people trying to retrieve them or has never been to a practice or previous Fast CAT then you might want to consider not entering the event.*
5. Refunds. Refunds will be made for cancellations made before entries close. Refunds will also be given for female dogs in season dogs that fail inspection during the event.

ELIGIBLE BREEDS & REGISTRY:

Open to all dogs at least 12 months of age that are individually registered with the AKC, recorded in the FSS program, dogs with PAL numbers or any other dog, including mixed breeds, enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program. Females in season may not enter. There are four “events” total, two per day, each split into two sessions, AM and PM. A dog may enter only once per “event”, either AM or PM. (An event is defined by an AKC event number). Thus, a dog may enter one or two AM runs OR one or two PM runs each day.

AM GROUP: 7:00 AM – 12pm

7:00 AM to 8:00 AM – Inspection – All dogs must be inspected. Dogs not inspected by 8:05 AM are considered absent and will not be run. Dogs that are also running in Event 2025098813 will be re-inspected after they complete their first run.

PM GROUP: 1pm – 6pm

1:00 PM to 2:00 PM – Inspection – All dogs must be inspected. Dogs not inspected by 2:05 PM are considered absent and will not be run. Dogs that are also running in Event 2025098813 will be re-inspected after they complete their first run.

Sunday (Events 202598814 and 2025098815 will be run concurrently in two groups (AM then PM))

AM GROUP: 7:00 AM – 12 NOON

7:00 AM to 8:00 AM – Inspection – All dogs must be inspected. Dogs not inspected by 8:05 AM are considered absent and will not be run. Dogs that are also running in Event 2025098815 will be inspected after they complete their first run.

PM GROUP: 1PM – 6PM

1:00 PM to 2:00 PM – Inspection – All dogs must be inspected. Dogs not inspected by 2:05 PM are considered absent and will not be run. Dogs that are also running in Event 2025098815 will be re-inspected after they complete their first run.

NOTE TIMES OF INSPECTIONS

- FOR MORNING EVENTS DOGS MUST BE PRESENT FOR INSPECTION BETWEEN 7AM AND 8AM
- FOR AFTERNOON EVENTS NO LATER THAN 2PM

A HANDLER’S MEETING WILL BE HELD AT THE START OF EACH EVENT
ANY DOG NOT PRESENT 5 MINUTES AFTER INSPECTION ENDS WILL BE CONSIDERED ABSENT.

General

1. All entries must be one year of age or older on the day of the test or trial.
2. Hounds not present at the time of roll call will be scratched after a five (5) minute grace period. No refunds will be given for scratched dogs.
3. Each entry will be examined and may be measured with a wicket at inspection. Inspection shall take place prior to any form of wrapping being applied to the dog. In the opinion of the inspection committee, any entry found to be lame, unfit to compete or a female in season shall not be allowed to enter and entry fees shall be refunded.
4. Dogs must be inspected before each event.
5. Entry fees shall be refunded for any entry that is withdrawn before entries close. Entries close April 30th or when limits are reached. No refund will be given for dogs withdrawn after the close of entry.
6. Run order will be assigned at time of inspection.
7. Dogs will be run by their run number with the following exceptions:
 - Workers who are managing the event will be allowed to run their dogs at an appropriate time.
 - Handlers with multiple dogs will have their dogs separated to allow them to walk their dogs out and retrieve the next dog
 - **If a dog is late for their run time, they will run at the end of the running order**
 - **If dog needs to rerun this will happen at the discretion of the Paddock Master**
8. For safety reasons, it is preferred that dogs run "naked" without collars or harnesses. A flat collar with no dangling tags is acceptable. Harnesses are allowed to get the dog to the line, but for safety please remove before the dog runs. Muzzles are allowed. Please no metal collars or retractable leads.
9. Electric continuous loop machines will be used. Lure will consist of white plastic bags
10. The field committee reserves the right to alter the course plan as required by weather and/or field conditions on the day of the trial.
11. The field committee reserves the right to bar known aggressive hounds from the event site.
12. **There will be a \$5 fine assessed for any loose hound not taking part in the course in progress, or for anybody caught not picking up after their dog or leaving garbage on the field.**
13. NO ONE will be allowed on the course without the express permission of the field chairman, except members of the field and event committee.
14. Anybody exhibiting unsportsmanlike behavior will be excused from the field and may be subject to further disciplinary action.
15. Control of dogs strictly enforced on leash at all times except when running.
16. Clean up and carry out all trash.
17. Please pick up all dog feces and remove with trash. DONOT put dog feces in portable toilets.

NOTES FOR FIRST TIME COURSERS AND HANDLERS

SLIP LEADS—There is a type of collar for coursing called a slip lead, which is worn only to control the dog prior to release. The collar drops away as the dog is released to chase the lure and they run without anything around their necks that could be dangerous. **Use of a slip lead is recommended but not required. What is important is that, for the safety of your dog, there are no objects on the dog that can be caught by the string or lure.**

INSPECTION—Dogs will be inspected by a designated Inspection Committee consisting of at least two persons who are members of the Field Committee and who shall inspect each entered dog for lameness, fitness to compete and female estrus (in season). Inspection shall take place prior to any form of wrapping being applied to the dog. In the opinion of the Inspection Committee, any entry found to be lame, unfit to compete or in season shall not be allowed to enter and the applicable entry fees shall be refunded. Dogs must be inspected before each event to assess whether an injury occurred since the last inspection.

WARM-UP, COOL-DOWN—It is highly recommended that all dogs running are walked out for about 10-15 minutes prior to and after their runs to get them warmed up and to cool them down. The warm up help reduce pulled muscles. The cool-down is very important to allow the dogs heart rate to slowly come to normal and because it helps prevent lactic acid build-up in the muscles that leads to soreness.

For Experienced Handlers

Pre-entered dogs can go directly to the Inspection Committee on the announcement of Inspection.

DIRECTIONS TO SITE

From I-5: take Corvallis Exit #228 (Hwy 34) toward Corvallis and Ocean Beaches (west). In about 10 miles there will be a signal light for Peoria Rd. At the next signal light turn left following signs to Philomath/Ocean Beaches (this is Philomath Blvd.) Continue to Philomath OR. In Philomath turn left onto 13th St. Field entrance will be marked with a sign on the right.

From 99W, enter Corvallis and follow signs to Philomath and Ocean Beaches to Philomath and turn left onto 13th St. Field entrance will be marked with a sign on the right.

From the Oregon Coast: take Highway 20 from Newport Or to Philomath. Turn right at 13th St. Field entrance will be marked with a sign on the right.

Refund Policy

Refunds will be given for dog withdrawn before closing.

If closing occurs because of entry limits a refund will be given only if another entry is received to fill the vacancy. Full Refunds will be given for female dogs in season or any dogs who do not pass inspection. Refunds will equal the entry fee minus any transaction fees from Square

What is a FAST CAT:

The Fast CAT Test is a timed 100-yard dash for dogs. It is meant to be fun and healthy activity of interest to any dog owner. The following is a summary of how the event is structured.

How Does Fast CAT Work?

1. Fast CAT is a timed straight race of 100 yards.
2. Dogs run singularly.
3. The dog's time to complete the 100-yard dash is converted into MPHs.
4. A handicap system is applied to a dog's MPH to determine the number of points earned. The handicap system is based on the height of the dog at its withers:
 - 18" or greater = handicap is 1.0.
 - 12" up to less than 18" = handicap is 1.5.
 - Below 12" = handicap is 2.0.
5. Points = MPH multiplied by the dog's handicap
6. Fast CAT titles suffix titles are earned at designated milestones:
 - BCAT = 150 points
 - DCAT = 500 points
 - FCAT = 1,000 points
 - FCAT# = every additional 500 points
7. Top 20 by Breed by Year: The AKC Fast CAT website will feature the Top 20 Fastest Dogs by Breed by Year national standings. The standings will be updated as event results are processed.
8. An inspection committee shall inspect each entry for lameness, fitness to compete and females in season. If necessary, the inspection committee is responsible for measuring dogs to determine their height at the withers.
9. Prior to moving the lure to position it for the start, the lure operator shall announce "hold your dogs" in order to caution owners.
10. The Start: Dogs may start up to 10 feet behind the starting line.
11. The Finish: The dog is timed from crossing the start line to the finish line. The owner/agent should have someone to release and catch the dog at the finish line.
12. Timing Devices: The time to complete the 100-yard dash is recorded to the nearest 1/100th of a second.
13. Lure Equipment: Clubs may use either a drag or continuous loop system. If a continuous loop system is used the "return" string must be set outside of the running course. The lure operator and the lure equipment shall be safely positioned in a manner that does not interfere with the retrieval of the dog at the end of the course.
14. Lure: A white plastic bag and a squawker may be used for the lure.
15. Course: The course must be essentially flat.
16. The huntmaster has control of the course. In summary, the huntmaster is in charge of all dogs and handlers on the field, shall ensure handlers understand safe release and retrieval procedures, shall ensure the lure is properly positioned, shall ensure the lure operator, timers and starting line signal person are ready, shall signal the lure operator to start the lure and shall give the verbal signal "tallyho" to release the dog.

What must my dog do to pass a Fast CAT?

Fast CAT, unlike the CAT, is not a pass/fail, but a timed 100-yard dash after a lure through a start gate and a stop gate. The time is converted over to MPH and then multiplied by a potential handicap based on the dog's height to award points.

Can my dog earn an AKC title for Fast CAT?

Titles are earned by accumulating points. The following titles will be awarded: BCAT = 150 points; DCAT = 500 points; FCAT = 1,000 points; and FCAT followed by a number (e.g. FCAT2) for every additional 500 points. These suffix titles will appear on a dog's pedigree, with a higher-level title superseding a lower level title.
